This week's major news updates in Pakistan's energy sector:

- Sindh's Energy Minister suggests greater reliance on coal for power generation.
- Gas consumers brace for a massive price hike.
- Pakistan is reported to owe 350 Billion US dollars to Chinese IPPs who refuse to renegotiate power purchase agreements; China's state-owned insurance company Sinosure is also reported to be reluctant to provide insurance cover to any new chinese power project in Pakistan.
- Seset by high oil prices, two thermal power plants show intent to use Thar coal for power generation.
