This week's major news updates in Pakistan's energy and climate sectors:

- Punjab allocates 795 billion rupees under the Climate Resilient Framework, constituting 64 percent of its annual development programme.
- Skhyber Pakhtunkhwa government protests against the removal of two hydropower projects—Gabral Kalam (88 megawatts) and Madian (157 megawatts)—from the Indicative Generation Capacity Expansion Plan (IGCEP) 2025–35.
- ⇒ The federal government pitches a three-year Industrial Support Package (2026–28) to foreign donors, seeking a 10.5 rupees per unit reduction in electricity tariff.
