

Weekly Media Monitor

October 13th – October 19th, 2025

This week's major news updates in Pakistan's energy and climate sectors:

- ➔ Jamshoro Power Company Limited removes a 660 megawatt coal-fired plant (unit II of a project originally funded by the Asian Development Bank) from its licence after its financing is cancelled.
- ➔ The government reports that floods caused 2.9 billion dollars in losses to Pakistan's economy. Major damage is recorded in agriculture and infrastructure sectors.
- ➔ The Port Qasim Electric Power Company warns that its 1,320 megawatt coal-fired plant may suspend operations if the Central Power Purchasing Agency-Guarantee (CPPA-G) fails to clear roughly 75.5 billion rupees in outstanding dues.
- ➔ The Private Power and Infrastructure Board (PPIB) casts uncertainty over the future of a dozen renewable energy projects, citing delays in finalising the Indicative Generation Capacity Expansion Plan (IGCEP) 2025-35
