

Weekly Media Monitor

January 19th, 2026 – January 25th, 2026

This week's major news updates in Pakistan's energy and climate sectors:

- ⇒ The federal government holds talks with the International Financial Institutions and Saudi Arabia to secure 36 billion US dollars in long-term loans to refinance the power sector's debt burden and help reduce electricity tariff for industry.
- ⇒ The World Bank raises concerns over proposed amendments to the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) Act 1997 and Electricity Act 1910, warning that these changes could weaken NEPRA's independence by shifting regulatory approval powers to the Power Division.
- ⇒ The Senate Standing Committee on Economic Affairs flags large-scale under-invoicing and suspected trade-based money laundering in solar kit imports under the Sindh Solar Energy Project.
